3 Important Steps

- 1 Make sure your manual loppers or powered hedge trimmers are sharp before starting any pruning project. Ask about our sharpening service on manual loppers and pruners.
- 2 Use powered hedge trimmers or loppers for trimming and shaping light growth. For limbs greater than 1/2" thick consider using some hook-nose loppers or a saw. For taller tree limbs use a pruning pole to cut without using a ladder.
- 3 When pruning flowering trees and shrubs research the particular kind of plant for the best time to prune without damaging the plant or flower production. As a general rule of thumb it's best to prune after flowering is done for the season.
